

Fly Minnesota Airports! is a program sponsored by MnDOT Aeronautics and the Minnesota Council of Airports to promote general aviation in Minnesota.

How does it work? This program rewards pilots who collect stamps in their passport book. Stamps are located near the weather computer at MN public airports. Pilots may earn three different levels of awards based on the amount of stamps collected at airports and other eligible aviation seminars/attractions.

Who is eligible?

The program is open to any FAA licensed pilot. Participants are not required to be a Minnesota resident.

Minnesota Weather Access System (MnWAS)

MnDOT provides computers for use in obtaining weather briefing information at airports throughout Minnesota. The homepage on these computers provides a list of suggested weather websites. However, users may also enter their preferred web address into the browser address bar. To access the MnWAS computer home page from any internet-enabled device, go to www.mndot.gov/aero and click on the "Pilots" tab and then "Flight Planning Resources".



The MnWAS homepage also has access to a form for reporting airport issues. Look for the "AvRep Kelly" logo and click on the link to let MnDOT know about concerns you might have about Minnesota airports.

From an optimum location on the airport, these stations measure and report wind direction and speed, visibility, sky condition, temperature, dew point, type of precipitation, lightning strikes and barometric pressure which is converted into an altimeter setting. Current weather information can be obtained by telephoning the AWOS/ASOS site. A computer generated voice relays up-to-the-minute observations.

The data is visually displayed on a remote computer monitor at most airports, and is simultaneously broadcast over the local radio navigation aid or a VHF transmitter for in-flight use. Data is gathered in 20-minute intervals from each AWOS site (ASOS data is gathered hourly with specials) and distributed nationally over an FAA NADIN computer network, allowing these reports to become available through computer weather systems such as MnWAS.

Where installed, the AWOS or ASOS is an official weather reporting source, and is approved without restriction for FAR Part 121 and 135 operations. If you have questions regarding weather observation stations, please contact Mike Hartell at 651-485-3698.

Hot Spots

The FAA has turned a spotlight on Runway Incursions. Anytime an aircraft, person or vehicle gets into the active runway environment without clearance, there is the possibility of a collision and loss of life. The FAA has been collecting and analyzing data on Runway Incursions at tower-controlled airports. When they identify areas on an airport where there have been Runway Incursions or where pilots and vehicle operators have gotten disoriented, those spots are identified as "Hot Spots."

The most current information on hot spots can be found in FAA publications on the airport diagrams in the approach plates and in the back of the ChartSupplement/Airport Facility Directory.

Runway Incursions occur at non-towered airports and they are just as dangerous. There is no data for non-towered airports, but we can apply some of what we have learned about towered airports at non-towered fields. Runway Incursions are more common at complex intersections where more than two runways or taxiways intersect. Beware of obstructed intersections where the pilot cannot see the entire length of the runway they are entering or crossing. Be cautious when operating at airports with parallel runways.

At both tower-controlled and non-towered airports one of the best tools for fighting Runway Incursions is to use an airport diagram. The airport diagrams in this directory cover all the Minnesota public airports. This information was current when we went to press, and as we become aware of changes, we update the diagrams on our website at: www.mndot.gov/aero.

For airports outside of Minnesota, many airport diagrams can be found in the Airport Facility Directory or the Instrument Approach Procedures. Airport diagrams for these airports and many more can also be found on the Internet. We cannot guarantee the accuracy of the information found on this or any other website outside of our control.



Seaplane Bases

The seaplane base diagrams include lake depth data and terrain data, obtained from the DNR. None of the seaplane bases have marked sea lanes, so it is recognized that seaplane pilots may choose to land in any direction. However, MnDOT felt that including the depth and terrain data would allow pilots to make safer decisions about the length of water available to them, and the obstructions along the shoreline and beyond.

Unfortunately there are gaps in the data. If you don't see water depth lines, the water is either very shallow or no data was available. If you don't see terrain shading, it may be because that data was not available. Moving forward MnDOT will look to provide better data as it becomes available.

The Minnesota Rules require that seaplanes clear all structures on the land by at least 100 feet. Clearance of all boats or persons on the surface of the water, whenever the body of water will permit, is required by not less than 300 feet, both laterally and vertically, or as close to 300 feet as the area of water will permit.

MnDOT wants to thank seaplane operators for the safe and professional flying they have exhibited in the past, and remind them to include these safety buffers in their future operations.

Seaplane Operations

State of Minnesota Department of Transportation

Compliance with Marine Traffic Rules: All seaplanes must comply with marine traffic rules to the extent that such rules do not interfere with the safe operations of aircraft. (Minnesota Rules 8800.2600).

Approaches and Takeoffs: All approaches and takeoffs from the water area shall be made in such a manner as to clear all structures on the land by at least 100 feet, and wherever the area of the body of water will permit, such landings and takeoffs shall be made at a distance of not less than 300 feet, both laterally and vertically, from any boat or person on the surface of the water, or as near to 300 feet as the area of the water will permit. (Minnesota Rules 8800.2700)

Seven-County Metro Area Operations: This part covers only seaplane operations on all public waters within the following counties: Anoka, Carver, Dakota, Hennepin, Ramsey, Scott and Washington. This part does not apply to aircraft equipped with either skis or wheels when public waters are frozen. See following tables for permissible public waters for seaplane operations within the seven-county metropolitan area and approximate coordinates. See Minnesota Rules 8800.2800 for full text and additional information on aircraft operations on lakes within the seven-county metropolitan area.

^{**}All seaplane operations are prohibited from 11 AM (CDST) to 6 PM (CDST) on Saturdays, Sundays, and national legal holidays between June 1 and September 15 on the following public waters:

State of Minnesota Department of Natural Resources

It is unlawful for any person to land any aircraft on lands or waters totally within the boundaries of any State Park except by permit or on a designated airport or landing strip or in making an emergency landing, conducting rescue operations or in conducting or assisting in the conduct of official business of the United States of America, the State of Minnesota, or the County in which the park is located. (Minnesota Rules 6100.2200)

Migratory Waterfowl Sanctuary Order Number 30

It has been determined in the best interests of proper game management to have waters set aside for migratory waterfowl feeding and resting areas. Therefore, the Department of Natural Resources prescribes related regulations which can be found in Minnesota Rules 6240.2000 and the Minnesota Waterfowl Hunting Regulations Guide.

Motors Prohibited on Migratory Waterfowl Feeding and Resting Areas

Annually a list of waters is designated by Commissioner's Order and by posting as migratory waterfowl feeding and resting areas during the open waterfowl season. No persons other than agents of the Commissioner in the performance of their duties may use any kind of motor propelled watercraft or aircraft on the listed water during the open migratory waterfowl season. Seaplane Operations and Federal Land

Regulations regarding flights over charted National Park Service Areas, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service Areas, and U.S. Forest Service Areas.

The landing of aircraft is prohibited on lands or waters administered by the National Park Service, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, or the U.S. Forest Service without authorization from the respective agency. Exceptions include:

- 1. When forced to land due to an emergency beyond the control of the operator.
- 2. At officially designated landing sites.
- 3. On approved official business of the United States Government.

All aircraft are requested to maintain a minimum altitude of 2000 feet above the terrain of the following: National Parks, Monuments, Seashores, Lakeshores, Recreation Areas and Scenic Riverways administered by the National Park Service, National Wildlife Refuges, Big Game Refuges, Game Ranges, and Wildlife Ranges administered by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and Wildlerness and Primitive Areas administered by the U.S. Forest Service.

Approaches and landings shall not be made within 500 feet of any developed facility, boat dock, float, pier, ramp or beach.

Aircraft may taxi to and from a dock or ramp designated for their use for the purpose of mooring and must be operated with due care and regard for persons and property and in accordance with any posted signs or waterway markers.

Areas within the designated lakes may be closed to aircraft use by the Superintendent taking into consideration public safety, wildlife management, weather and park management objectives.

Pilots should contact the park to ensure no additional special closures. See 36 CFR 7.33c for full text and additional information.

Invasive Species Alert for Seaplane Pilots

Seaplane pilots are asked to be aware of the presence of invasive and exotic species in many bodies of water within and adjacent to the State of Minnesota. These include: Eurasian water milfoil, zebra mussels, and the spiny water flea to name a few. The Department of Natural Resources appreciates any efforts seaplane pilots can provide in preventing the spread of these damaging species. Pilots can help prevent the spread of these species via seaplanes by scrubbing the hull of the plane or floats while still in the water of the infected lake. This is especially important if the aircraft has been moored on an infested lake for more than a few hours. The removal of water from the float or bilge compartments prior to departure is encouraged to further limit the possibility of transporting these species which could infect other bodies of water. If possible, just prior to takeoff raise and lower your water rudders a number of times to help clear any aquatic hitchhikers. After takeoff at a safe altitude, if conditions permit, raise and lower your water rudders a number of times while still over the waters that you departed to clear aquatic plants from the water rudders and cables.

For the most current and complete list of lakes that harbor invasive species and how to do your part to prevent transporting them by seaplane, please visit the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources website at www.dnr.state.mn.us/invasives/ais/index.html for guidance. Remember, it is against Minnesota law to transport aquatic species from one body of water to another.

Help Prevent the Spread of Aquatic Invasive Species by Seaplanes

Many invasive species, such as zebra mussels and Eurasian watermilfoil, can be unintentionally transported from one water to another on the floats of seaplanes. Many state and federal agencies recommend that you include these procedures into the operation of your seaplane. However, plane safety should remain the first priority when considering and following these recommendations.

RECOMMENDED ACTIONS

Before entering the aircraft:

- √ Pump floats (note: this will also help avoid spreading fish diseases).
- √ Inspect for and remove aquatic plants and animals (e.g., zebra mussels and water fleas) from the floats, wires or cables, and water rudders.

Aircraft moored for extended periods in zebra mussel infested waters may have zebra mussels attached to the floats and should be checked specifically on the transom, chine, bottom, wheel wells, and the step area of floats (see diagram). If you see or feel zebra mussels on the floats (small zebra mussels feel gritty), one or more of the following should be used before leaving the waterbody when facilities are available:

- · wash with hot water; or
- · spray with high-pressure water; and/or
- dry all parts of the floats for at least 5 days
 (A few days of hot summer temperatures will kill adult zebra mussels. Longer drying times of several

days are required to kill adult mussels during cool, humid weather.

✓ In remote locations where zebra mussels are present, but where there are no provisions for drying or spraying — hand-cleaning the underside of floats with a scrub brush and physically removing adult mussels is the best option available option for preventing the spread of zebra mussels. A plastic scraper may be helpful to remove adult zebra mussels.


Pre take-off check:

- √ Avoid taxiing through heavy surface growths of aquatic plants before takeoff; and
- √ Raise and lower water rudders several times to clear off plants (this will also minimize cable stretch and improve the effectiveness of the rudders for steering).

After take-off:

- √ Raise and lower water rudders several times to free aquatic plant fragments while over the waters you are leaving or while over land; and
- √ If aquatic plants remain attached, return to the lake and remove the plants.


